

SUMMER SCHOOL REGULATIONS

Hebrew Language, Heritage and Jewish Culture – ULPAN 2021, Krakow

1. The Summer School of Hebrew Language, Heritage and Jewish Culture, hereinafter referred to as Ulpán, is a summer time form of improving knowledge of the Hebrew language and expanding knowledge of Jewish heritage addressed to a wide range of adult audiences, in particular students of the Jagiellonian University and the University of Potsdam.
2. Ulpán is organized by the Institute of Jewish Studies of the Jagiellonian University in cooperation with the School of Jewish Theology, University of Potsdam, as part of the Summer School of Hebrew Language, Heritage and Jewish Culture project co-financed by the Polish-German Foundation for Science.
3. The prerequisite for participation in Ulpán is the acceptance of these Regulations, which is tantamount to agreeing to the participation of the candidate in the organized classes.
4. Recruitment to Ulpán is conducted through registration applications (Application Form) submitted to the Institute of Jewish Studies, Jagiellonian University in Kraków, ul. Józefa 19, 310-56 Kraków until 15 July 2021.
5. Eligible participants include students or doctoral students of the Jagiellonian University and the University of Potsdam. Students from other academic centers may be admitted in case of remaining seats.
6. Due to the limited number of seats, participation is determined on the basis of a candidate's CV, the level of Hebrew language proficiency and the ability of the organizers to organize sufficiently numerous classes (groups ranging from beginner to advanced may be open).
7. Persons accepted into Ulpán will receive an invitation e-mail by 15 July 2021 to the candidate's mailbox as indicated in the Application Form.

8. Ulpan will host a total of 48 people divided into four groups, depending on the level of Hebrew language proficiency.
9. Ulpan will take place in August 9-27, 2021. Classes will be conducted remotely. The part of the summer school comprising lectures and walks expanding knowledge of Jewish heritage and culture will take place in stationary form in Krakow in 9-12 August. The execution of this part will depend on current conditions and pandemic restrictions. The stationary part will not be mandatory.
10. The persons attending the classes should have access to a computer, a web camera, and an internet connection, allowing them to join meetings on the Internet platform. Participation in the stationary part will require full compliance with sanitary guidelines and restrictions.
11. Classes will start in the morning (9:00 am at the earliest) and end in the afternoon (no later than 5:00 pm).
12. The Institute of Judaism of the Jagiellonian University reserves the right to transfer the stationary part to a remote form if the epidemic situation should dictate that, as well as making other changes to the Ulpan programme.
13. Participation in Ulpan is free of charge. The organizers do not cover the cost of travel, accommodation or meals for participants of the stationary part. The Jagiellonian University and University of Potsdam will provide teaching aids in electronic form and access to activity groups on the Internet platform.
14. Ulpan participants are required to participate in all remote classes from the beginning to the end of the summer school, including the final exam, scheduled for August 27, 2021. Participants must be present in at least 80% of the remote classes and pass the final exam to formally complete the programme.

15. The full Ulpan programme will be published on the website of the Institute of Judaism of the Jagiellonian University by 15 July 2021.
16. During their stay in Krakow, participants are responsible for their own safety, especially during leisure time outside of Ulpan classes. In particular, participants are obliged to comply with epidemic restrictions, if any. Participants will have a comprehensive health and accident insurance that are valid throughout their participation in the programme. Participants are required to submit a policy prior to joining the programme.
17. In case of a deliberate act, as a result of which the Jagiellonian University should suffer losses (e.g. costs of purchasing or repairing equipment, furniture or premises), the participant responsible bears the costs.
18. According to art. 13 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data ("General Regulation"), hereinafter referred to as "GDPR", the Jagiellonian University informs that :
19. The administrator of your personal data are the Jagiellonian University, with headquarters at 24 Gołębia Street, Cracow 31-007 and the University of Potsdam, Am Neuen Palais 10, 14469 Potsdam.
20. The Data Protection Supervisor, appointed by the Jagiellonian University, is based at room no. 27, 4 Czapskich street, Cracow 31-110. The Officer can be contacted in person from Monday to Friday (8: 30 am-3:30 pm) or via e-mail: iod@uj.edu.pl or by phone – 12 663 12 25.
21. Your personal data will be processed for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller pursuant to art. 6 par. 1it. F GDPR which is the organization of the Ulpan.
22. Providing your personal data is voluntary but is necessary for participation in the Ulpan. If you refuse to provide your data, you may not enter the Ulpan.

23. Your personal data will not be made available to other subjects, except for the partner of the Ulpan, University of Potsdam and the Polish-German Foundation for Science.
24. With the exception of agreements between the Jagiellonian University or University of Potsdam with the Internet platform provider, your personal data will not be transferred to third countries (outside the European Economic Area) or to international organizations.
25. Your data will be stored for the duration of the organization of Ulpan and until the expiration of the statute of limitations for claims that may arise from the participation in the Ulpan.
26. You have the right to: access your data and rectify it, delete it (unless further processing is necessary to comply with legal obligations or to establish, investigate or defend claims), limit its processing, transfer such data, object to its processing.
27. Your personal data will not be subject to automatic decision making or profiling.
28. You have the right to lodge a complaint to the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection if you feel that the processing of your personal data is in violation of the provisions of the General Regulation.
