

## **Personal data protection**

Pursuant to Article 13 of the Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (EU) 2016/679 of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter: GDPR), Jagiellonian University informs that:

1. The Controller of your personal data is Jagiellonian University, ul. Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, represented by the JU Rector.
2. Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Officer ul. Czapskich 4, room 27, 31-110 Kraków. The Officer can be contacted via email: [iod@uj.edu.pl](mailto:iod@uj.edu.pl), by phone at 12 663 12 25, from Monday to Friday between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m.
3. Your personal data provided in the application to the recruitment for becoming a member of research group within Jewish Studies at the JU Institute of Jewish Studies, will be processed:
  - a. in the case of all Candidates - for the purposes of carrying out the Recruitment (hereinafter: Recruitment) pursuant to Article 6.1.f of the GDPR, i.e. for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Controller, which consists in identifying successful Candidates with whom an agreement is subsequently concluded.
  - b. For the candidates selected to the research group – Researchers – for the purpose of concluding the agreement and performing tax obligations pursuant to Article 6.1.b and Article 6.1.c.
4. While providing your personal data is voluntary, it is a necessary prerequisite for taking part in the Recruitment. Failing to provide personal data precludes participation in the Recruitment. In the case of Candidates referred to under point 3.b providing personal data constitutes legal obligation
5. Personal data of the Candidates referred to under point 3.a will not be made available to third parties.
6. Personal data of the Candidates referred to under point 3.b may be published on the Organiser's website for the purpose of publishing the recruitment's results. These data will also be made available to authorised public authorities, including, in particular, to the extent that these authorities are authorised to verify the fulfilment of the legal obligations imposed on the Organiser as the authority promising the award.
7. Your personal data shall not be transferred to third countries (outside the EEA) / to international organisations.
8. Personal data of the Candidates referred to under point 3.a shall be processed until the Recruitment is concluded and its results made known.

Personal data of the Candidates referred to under point 3.b shall be processed in the period resulting from fiscal regulations, and subsequently, for archiving purposes, pursuant to applicable legal

regulations. These data will continue to be processed pursuant to the agreement concluded with the successful candidates.

9. You have the following rights: to obtain information on personal data processing and rights resulting from the GDPR, to access your data and rectify them, as well as to have them deleted from the controller's database (unless further processing is necessary for fulfilling a legal obligation or for the purposes of determining, pursuing, or defending claims), to limit their processing or transfer, and to object to the processing of the data – in the cases and under the conditions specified in the GDPR.
10. Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision making or profiling.
11. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection, should you ascertain that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.
